Entry Fees

Class Fees: \$12.00 per head for the Boer show and \$20.00 per head for the Market Jackpot. Late fees are \$5.00 per animal.

Entry Forms and Parking Passes

Entry Forms are available for download from the NMMGA.org website. No online entry is available for this division.

Parking passes are available from the State Fair Livestock office, or a parking pass request form can be downloaded from the NMMGA.org website and passes will be mailed to you prior to the show. Please remember parking passes must be purchased prior to the show. There are no parking passes sold at the gate.

Arrival / Departure

Begins at noon on Sept. 19th, but must be on grounds by 7:00 pm. Release at conclusion of show on Sunday, September 24th.

Exhibitor Rules

All Market and Boer Goats will be stalled in the Swine Barn

1. All rules governing livestock in the General Rules and Regulations apply to this section.
2. All complaints filed by International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. members, fair officials or the exhibitors pertaining to the ethics and competency of a judge are to be referred to International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. Judges Committee and/or Ethics Committee in writing within one week of occurrence. A witness signature or corroborating statement is recommended. All complaints pertaining to the actions and/or conduct of an exhibitor are to be addressed to the Ethics Committee and submitted in writing within one week of occurrence. All complaints regarding judges are to be sent with a non-refundable fee of \$35.00, to defray the expense of reviewing such complaint, to the International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. office.

3. The Breed Standards of the International Boer Goat Association and all other International Boer Goat Association show rules herein specified will be observed and upheld at this show.

4. Goats entered in the Boer show must have a certificate of registration. Ages will be determined by the birth date on the registration certificate and calculated to date of show.

5. An original registration certificate is required for all animals 6 months and older that are entered in the show. A stamped duplicate or faxed registration application showing the date of receipt by the registering office will be accepted on arrivals under 6 months of age.

6. Proof of ownership shall be the name on the registration certificate. Persons showing animals with signed transfers on the registration certificate must show these animals as an agent for the owner listed.

7. Eligibility - Only animals registered in a recognized Association (International Boer Goat Assn., Inc, American Boer Goat Assn., Canadian Boer Goat Assn., and The USBGA) may be shown in official International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. Sanctioned shows. Only International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. registered animals may be awarded points. If animal is not International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. registered, owner has the option to register winning animals within five (5) business days with International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. and still be eligible to be awarded points. If winning animal is not International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. registered within allotted time, points will not be awarded.

8. All animals must have a legible tattoo that matches the registration papers and all animals entered are subject to having tattoos and papers checked at any time. Any animal winning Grand and Reserve Champion will be checked and must have a legible tattoo that matches the registration certificate or it will not be awarded the Champion Seal or Rosette. The birth date shall also be checked at the time this animal must have competed in the proper age division classification, if this does not match, the animal will not be awarded the Champion Seal or Rosette. In these cases, the Champion Seal and Rosette will be awarded to the Reserve Champion.

9. The judges' decision will be final.

10. No animal will be presented to a judge that has been purchased or possession taken from that judge within 90 days of the show.

11. An exhibitor that is showing an animal with a microchip as permanent identification is required to provide a microchip reader for verification of animal identity.
12. An exhibitor shall not knowingly show an animal that does not meet eligibility requirements.
13. An exhibitor shall not present an animal to be shown under a judge who is his/her immediate family or employer or employee.
14. The exhibitor shall take caution when entering their animals in a show not to compromise the judge's integrity.
15. If a complaint is filed or we have reason to believe that an animal has been given growth-enhancing drugs, we reserve the right to test the animal in question. If the animal tests positive, the points awarded will be forfeited.
16. No exhibitor will talk with the judge unless they are spoken to first, while in the show ring.
17. If an animal is registered in the International Boer Goat Assn., Inc., that registration number must be listed on the entry form.
18. No painting, powdering or artificial coloring is allowed. Normal grooming materials and dressings of leg hair is allowed.
19. No Professional Fitters are allowed to prepare goat for show.
20. No dogs or animals not entered in the show will be allowed on the grounds. The Exception is: "Platinum Champion" status animals are eligible to be displayed during the show.

Market Jackpot Rules

1. Wether and doe kids will be allowed to show in the jackpot. Tooth rule will be waived to due the late show date.
2. Exhibitors of any age will be allowed to show.
3. Exhibitor must have owned their animal a minimum of 60 days prior to the show.
4. Show Superintendent will weigh all market animals and divide them into classes. There will be no minimum or maximum number of animals per class.

Class size will be determined by weight in order to insure that weight disparity is as fair to exhibitors as possible. There will be no maximum number or minimum number of classes. The number of weight classes will be determined by weight breaks, regardless of how large or small the classes are. Priority is to provide maximum equity for all exhibitors.

5. Market goats must be slick shorn with 3/8" of hair or less at the time of arrival.
6. Exhibitors are not required to have horns tipped. Dehorning is acceptable.
7. Exhibitors must weigh in at designated time. There will be a 30# minimum weight. There will be no top weight limit.
8. Exhibitors will be allowed to use halters or collars in the show ring.
9. Exhibitors will not lift front legs of goats off of the ground or brace the animal during examination by the judge. The animal should stand in a natural position with the front legs at a natural width and squarely beneath the withers. The hind legs should be at a natural width, squarely beneath the animal, and placed even in the back with the pin bones. The handler shall stand or kneel on the side of the animal away from the Judge and avoid at all times being between the Judge and the animal.
9. In the event of behavior deemed rude, disrespectful, or un-sportsman like in the ring, to a judge or another exhibitor: the exhibitor shall be given one verbal warning to cease and desist such behavior immediately. A warning from the show superintendent is considered to be sufficient. A second warning can result in dismissal and or suspension.

Brand Requirements

1. All goats, regardless whether traveling in OR out of district, MUST have a Certificate of Livestock Inspection from your local Livestock Inspector.

NMSF Health Requirements

Out Of State Origin

1. Health Certificate & Prior Entry Permit required. Certificate must be presented before unloading animals.
2. Negative Brucellosis test if 6 months of age or over, unless from a certified free herd.
3. Negative TB test if 6 months of age or over, unless from an Accredited herd.

4. Goats with any of the following conditions shall not be exhibited and must be removed immediately from the exhibition area:

- (i) Lesions of contagious ecthyma (sore mouth).
- (ii) Active lesions of ringworm with resulting loss of hair.
- (iii) Caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses.
- (iv) Any open or draining abscess.
- (v) Any observable contagious disease.

5. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to check with their vets for requirements to cross state lines.

Federal Sheep and Goat ID Requirements for Scrapie

Sheep and goats that are sexually intact and used for breeding, show and/or exhibition are required to have official individual animal and premises identification prior to sale or movement. For further information, contact Mike Greenly, USDA, Albuquerque Office, (505) 761-3160.

Drug Testing

All animals entered are subject to drug testing. The use of any medication is subject to the manufacturer's label and FDA approval. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor, owner, and those who may assist them, to insure that all medications are used within label guidelines. Any animal found in violation shall be stripped of awards and exhibitor and/or owner shall be subject to such penalties as the Judges and Ethics committees deem appropriate.
